



FRIENDS OF RANDOLPH SCHOLARS

DAN AND GLADYS WEINEL SCHOLARSHIP GUIDELINES

1. Scholarships may only be granted to Qualified Graduates of Randolph High School ISD 195 (or its successors if the current Randolph High School is divided into multiple high schools serving the community or is consolidated into one or more other school districts ("Successors")). A Qualified Graduate is a student who graduates from Randolph High School (or its Successors) and who has lived in the district for at least one year prior to graduation or has been open-enrolled in the district for at least two years prior to graduation.
2. Applicants must have a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or better and an ACT composite score of 25 or better to apply. Students not selected as a recipient of the Dan and Gladys Weinel Scholarship may reapply the following year(s) as an undergraduate with proof they are enrolled in a program meeting the criteria as set forth in paragraph number 3.
3. Scholarships may be granted only to those who are pursuing degrees in Qualified Engineering Curricula at top 100 engineering schools based upon *U.S. News and World Reports* ranking of Best Engineering Schools for the year in which the scholarship is initially awarded. For such purposes, (i) Qualified Engineering Curricula include only programs leading to a degree in civil, aeronautical, mechanical, electrical, aerospace, chemical, biomedical, and metallurgical engineering.
4. Such scholarships may be awarded (i) for both undergraduate and postgraduate studies on a partial or full basis, and (ii) based on need and/or merit but with particular focus on merit.
5. To the extent that sufficient funds are available, it is expected that any awarded scholarship will include tuition, room and board, books and supplies until the recipient receives his or her engineering degree, assuming that the recipient continues to adhere to the continuing scholarship requirements set forth in the following paragraph. The amount of the scholarship is contingent on the earnings generated from the scholarship investment and the amount awarded may vary from year to year. These earnings will be divided among all recipients each year. Scholarships are paid upon proof of successful completion of the first semester and proof of each successful semester thereafter.
6. In order for the scholarship to continue, the recipient must meet the following requirements:
 - a. The recipient must maintain full-time student status in a Qualified Engineering Curriculum.
 - b. A cumulative 3.0 GPA (on a 4 point scale) must be maintained by the recipient.
 - c. The recipient must live on or near campus.
 - d. The recipient must participate in paid or unpaid summer work (for at least 6 weeks duration) in an engineering internship or engineering related field.
 - e. The recipient, after the first school year, is required to work paid or unpaid part time during the school year in the engineering department on campus.
 - f. The recipient must provide regular reports of coursework, grades and employment to Friends of Randolph Scholars, and must respond promptly to reasonable inquiries made by Friends of Randolph Scholars.
