- 2) A motion to approve the agenda as established was made by Sara Taylor, seconded by Jason Podritz. All members voting in favor.

- Vanda Pressnall, Intermediate School District 917 Board Member reported on the 917 School District, which included: Superintendent John Christianson will be retiring June 2017. District 917 needs to expand the Therapeutic Education Alternative (TEA) Program and is looking at the Rainbow Building on Highway 55 this is for students with emotional needs that need 1 on 1 service. They also need to expand the Students With Unique Needs (SUN) Program for autistic students. They use to have one classroom and now they are up to 9 classrooms. Impact on the lease levy will be very minimal for Randolph School. Contracts for District 917 will have an 8% increase. No changes to Career and Technology at this time. Vanda invited the School Board to 917's Open House on March 8.
- A motion to approve the 2018-2019 School Calendar was made by Garlan Dubbels, seconded by Cory Lorenzen. All members voting in favor.
- Principal/Special Ed Director, reported grades 7-12 will be attending the College & Career Fair at Hastings High School on February 22, which is sponsored by the Dakota County Perkins Consortium; class registration for next school year will be done online in Infinite Campus this year once training has been completed; MCA Testing begins March 6.
- Aaron Soule, Assistant HS Principal/Activities Director reported we will have a Mock Car Crash on April 25th; our High Kick Dance Team went to state for the 5th year in a row; Alumni Tournament will be March 17 & 18; Fill the Gym Night was February 16 our students showed their support for their opponents Mabel Canton School by wearing t-shirts during warm-ups and collecting \$550.00 in donations for the Mabel Canton Arneson family that recently, tragically loss two of their five children in a car accident. One of the refs that night also donated his referee check.
- 9) Patty Riemenschneider, Business Manager, reported on eFinancePlus training. We will be going live with the new HR/Finance Program in July 2018.
- Michael Kelley, Superintendent, reported member districts voted to dissolve TIES on January 24th; lockdown with intruder drill on February 12; North Gym new roof top unit will be installed February 27; MSBA Day at the Capitol is March 19; Facilities Master Plan Task Force has received 7 applicants from the Randolph Community so far; something new this year met with all employees in small groups regarding their positions, outlook of Randolph Schools, and what motivates them which was great input; Bus Inspections will be March 15; Dance State Tournament Overnight Field Trip falls under Policy 610 exceptions for prior board approval; Detroit Tigers have picked up former student, Caleb Thielbar; elementary is continuing to look at new reading curriculum to find better pricing; we will be starting a Grab & Go Breakfast for grades 3-5; Kindergarten Round-Up will be on March 6; Community Education's new afterschool Chess & Checkers class has been a huge success with 46 registered.
